

# Sunday of the Holy God-bearing Fathers of the First Six Ecumenical Councils



Many Christian Churches in America were founded by a pastor who had a Bible, a microphone and a conviction that God wanted him to preach. So he gathered a few followers (often his own relatives), rented space and scheduled services. Americans see nothing unusual in this - after all freedom of speech and individual initiative are hallmarks of the American way of doing things. Why not in the Church? The historic Churches (those of the first centuries) saw things differently. Many of these Churches had, in fact, been founded by one of the apostles or their co-workers. They emphasized that the Church is the Body of

Christ, an organic unity of Head and members. Like St Paul, these Churches saw unity as a chief mark of the Church and an important part of their mission "endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all" (Ephesians 4:3-6). Still, the first centuries saw a number of teachers with competing doctrines arise in the Church. When they were not accepted by the leaders of a local Church, these teachers or their followers formed there own rival groups. In some places these groups became more popular than the historic Church. Arians, for example, were prominent in Constantinople through much of the fourth century and in much of the West through the fifth.

When Emperor Constantine accepted Christ and recognized the Church as an important structure in his empire, he faced the rivalry between these groups. In his quest for a strong and united Church, he called the first Ecumenical Council as a vehicle for unifying the teaching and practices of the empire. There had been councils before, of course, but always on regional levels. This council involved bishops from the entire empire (the *ecumene*) under Constantine's rule. He set a

precedent which would be repeated several times during the first millennium. The first six councils were:

- 1. First Council of Nicaea (325)
- 3. Council of Ephesus (431)
- 5. Second Council of Constantinople (553)
- 2. First Council of Constantinople (381)
- 4. Council of Chalcedon (451)
- 6. Third Council of Constantinople (680-681)

#### Commemoration of the Holy Martyrs CYRICUS and his mother JULITTA

A native of Iconium, Saint Julitta lived under Emperor Diocletian. Fleeing the persecution, she took her three year old son Cyricus and went to Seleucia. Finding the same misfortunes there, she went to Taurus in Cilicia where she was seized and led before the Governor. The Governor snatched her son and by caresses and flatteries tried to draw him to him. Crying and stammering Christ's name, the child kicked the Governor's chest as much as he could. Provoked, the Governor smashed his head against the steps of the tribunal. After many tortures his blessed mother was beheaded around the year 296.
