




Commemoration of the Holy Prophet Habakkuk

The Holy Prophet Habakkuk, the eighth of the Twelve Minor Prophets, was descended from the Tribe of Simeon, and he prophesied around 650 B.C.

The Prophet Habakkuk foresaw the destruction of the Jerusalem Temple, the Babylonian Captivity and the later return of the captives to their native land. During the war with the Babylonians the prophet withdrew to Arabia, where the following miracle occurred. When he was bringing dinner to the reapers, he met an angel of the Lord, and instantly by the strength of his spirit he was transported to Babylon, where at the time the Prophet Daniel was languishing in prison. BEING MELKITE - DID YOU KNOW? The Sign of the Cross is made by joining three fingers (thumb, index and middle) together; putting two fingers (ring and little) down on the palm and lifting the hand first to the forehead, then to the chest, then to the right shoulder, and then the left shoulder. The thumb and first two fingers held together represent the Holy Trinity: God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The ring finger and little finger signify the two natures of Christ: Human and Divine. In the Scriptures right generally represents good and left evil, and in the Creed the Son is said to sit at the right hand of the Father, thus the signing of the right shoulder first. ^{2,3}


