



Saint of the Day

Commemoration of our venerable Father EUTHYMIUS THE GREAT



Saint Euthymius was born in 377, in Melitene, Armenia, under Emperor Gratian (367-383). Baptized when three years old, he was ordained a lector by Eutroius, Bishop of Melitene. He was ordained to the priesthood when he was nineteen years old, in 395, and was named Exarch of the monasteries. He went to Jerusalem in 405-406. In 411, he withdrew to the grotto of Saint Theoktistos. By his virtue, he contended so nobly with the Saracens that, day by day, he disposed them to adhere to Christ and to be baptized with their families, in 420-421. He fought the Nestorians, the Eutychians, and the Manicheans. In 455-456, he brought back to the true faith, the wife of Theodosius Eudocia. Younger, who had fallen into the Monophysite heresy. He performed numerous miracles. One day while celebrating the Divine Liturgy he appeared as a column of fire. He died at the grand old age of ninety-seven, during the reign of Emperor Leo the Great, on January 20, 473. 1

BEING MELKITE - DID YOU KNOW? Standing is the normal posture of prayer in the Eastern Christian liturgical tradition representing the resurrection of Christ. Living during the period c. AD 160-220, Tertullian refers to this tradition as the norm in the Latin West as well: We consider it unlawful to fast or to pray kneeling on Sundays and from the day of Pascha to that of Pentecost (De Cor. Mil. s. 3, 4). This liturgical tradition was later declared at the council of Nicea in AD 325 to be the universal practice for the Church: Since there are certain persons who are kneeling on Sunday and the period from Pascha until Pentecost, it has seemed good to the holy Council to declare, so that all things may be uniformly observed everywhere, that prayer to the Lord should be made during these times standing (Canon 20). For this reason, Orthodox Christians stand during liturgical services occurring from Pascha until Pentecost, and every Sunday throughout the year. Kneeling is the normal posture of penitence in the Eastern Christian tradition. Eastern Christians often kneel during liturgical services held on days other than Sunday which fall outside the period between Pascha and Pentecost. ²

Troparion of Resurrection (Tone 2)

A READING from the Second Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians



RETHREN, God who commanded light to shine out of darkness, has shone in our hearts, to give enlightenment concerning the knowledge of God's glory, shining in Christ Jesus' face. But we carry this treasure in vessels of clay, to show that its superabundant power is God's, and not ours. In all things we suffer tribulation but

we are not distressed, we are sorely pressed but we are not destitute, we endure persecution but we are not forsaken, we are cast down but we do not perish: always carrying around in our body the dying of Jesus, so that the life also of Jesus may be made manifest in our bodily frame. For we, the living, are constantly being handed over to death for Jesus's sake, that the life also of Jesus may be made manifest in our mortal flesh. Thus death is at work in us. but life in you.

But since we have the same spirit of faith, as shown in that which is written, I believed, and so I spoke, (Ps.115:1) we also believed, wherefore we also speak. For we know that the one who raised up the Lord Jesus will raise us up also together with Jesus, and will place us with you. For all things are for your sakes, so that the grace that abounds through the many may cause thanksgiving to abound for God's glory.
