Fifth Sunday of Lent - Our Holy Mother St. Mary of Egypt

St. Mary of Egypt (ca. 340-420) left her family at the age of twelve and traveled to Alexandria where she lived a life of great depravity and promiscuity. Falling in, one day, with a band of pilgrims, she traveled to Jerusalem and on the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross attempted to enter the church with the others. Some unseen force barred her entry. Greatly dismayed, she prayed and vowed that if she were able to enter and worship the true Cross, she would turn away from her wicked ways. Her prayer was answered. She was able to enter the church and worship the Holy Wood. She then left Jerusalem, crossed the Jordan into the wilderness lived an austere life for almost fifty years, fasting and praying, with virtually no human contact. One day, she happened upon the hermit Zosimas, whom she asked to bring the Eucharist, which he did the following Holy Thursday. Zosimas returned the following year and found Mary's mortal remains. She is a powerful example for us regarding our own prayer and fasting.

Antiphon Prayer

O Lord God, You examine the inner heart. You know our concerns before they emerge into being. You saved Mary of Egypt from the tribulations of this earth, for she had recourse to You. We implore You to purify our hearts and to make us temples of your Holy Spirit and rich in virtues, so that we may glorify You by hymns of praise and good works. For You are our God and to You are due all glory, honor and worship, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, now and always and forever and ever.

Troparion of the Resurrection (*Tone 1*) After the stone was sealed by the Jews * and the while the soldiers were watching Your spotless body, * You rose, O Savior, on the third day,* bestowing life to the world.* Therefore the heavenly powers cried out to You, O Giver of life:*"Glory to Your resurrection, O Christ! * Glory to Your kingdom! * Glory to Your economy, * O You Who alone are the lover of mankind!"

Troparion of our Mother Mary of Egypt

In you, O Mother Mary, was restored the likeness of God, for you carried your cross and followed Christ. You taught by your deeds how to spurn the body, for it passes away and how to value the soul, for it is immortal. Wherefore your soul is forever in happiness with the angels.

Troparion of St. Jacob, Brother of the Lord (Tone 4)

As a disciple of the Lord, you received the Gospel, O holy Jacob. As a martyr, you displayed unyielding will. As a brother of God, you have special power with Him. As a hierarch, you have the right of intercession. Intercede, therefore, with Christ God that he may save our souls.

Kondakion "O never-failing Protectress."

O never failing Protectress of Christians and their everpresent intercessor before the Creator, despise not the petitions of us sinners, but in your goodness extend your help to us who call upon you with confidence. Hasten, O Mother of God, to intercede for us, for you have always protected those who honor you.

الرسالة (عبرانيين9: 11- 14)

BRETHREN, when Christ appeared as the high priest of the good things to come (Cf.Lv.16: 14; 19: 4), he entered once for all through the greater and more perfect tabernacle, not made by hands (that is, not as a part of the present creation), nor again by virtue of blood of goats and calves, but by virtue of his own blood, into the sanctuary, having obtained eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkled ashes of a heifer sanctify the unclean for the cleansing of the flesh, how much more will the blood of Christ (Cf. Rv. I: 5), who through the Holy Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse your conscience from dead works to serve the living God!

<u>Gospel:</u> 5th Sunday of Lent, Mark 10: 32-45 THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO ST. MARK THE EVANGELIST Mark 10, 32-45

At that time Jesus took the Twelve, and began to tell them what would happen to him, saying, "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be betrayed to the chief priests and the Scribes; and they will condemn him to death, and will deliver him to the Gentiles; and they will mock him, and spit upon him and scourge him, and put him to death; and on the third day he will rise again." And James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to him, saying, "Master, we want thee to do for us whatever we ask." But he said to them, "What do you want me to do for you?" And they said, "Grant to us that we may sit, one at thy right hand and the other at thy left hand, in thy glory." But Jesus said to them.

"You do not know what you are asking for. Can you drink of the cup of which I drink, or be baptized with the baptism with which I am to be baptized?" And they said to him, "We can." And Jesus said to them "Of the cup that I drink, you shall drink; and with the baptism with which I am to be baptized, you shall be baptized; but as for sitting at my right hand or at my left, that is not mine to give, but it belongs to those for whom it has been prepared." And when the ten heard this, they were at first indignant at James and John. But Jesus called them and said to them, "You know that those who are regarded as rulers among the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great men exercise authority over them. But it is not so among you. On the contrary, whoever wishes to become great shall be your servant; and whoever wishes to be first among you shall be the slave of all; for the Son of Man also has not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."
