Today we commemorate the HIEROMARTYR (PRIESTLY-MARTYR) ANTHIMOS. He was born in Nicomedia, and was raised from childhood as a true Christian. "His body was mortified, his spirit humbled, his envy uprooted, his anger subdued, his sloth banished.... He had love for all and peace with all; he was prudent with all, had zeal for the glory of God and was forthright with all." It is no wonder that a man with such virtues was appointed bishop. St. Anthimos governed as Bishop of Nicomedia during the cruel persecution of Christians under the villainous Emperors Diocletian and Maximian. Streams of Christian blood were shed, especially in Nicomedia. One year, on the Feast of Christ's Nativity, twenty thousand martyrs were burned to death in one church (see December 28). This took place during the time of Anthimos' episcopacy. Even so, the persecution did not end with this, but continued, and many Christians were cast into prison and kept there for torture and death. St. Anthimos withdrew to the village of Semana, not because he was fleeing from death, but in order to continue encouraging his flock in the feat of martyrdom, so that no one would fall away out of fear. One of his letters to the Christians in prison was intercepted and turned over to Emperor Maximian. The emperor dispatched twenty soldiers to find Anthimos and bring him to him. The gray-haired and clairvoyant elder came out to meet the soldiers, brought them to his house, and treated them as guests--and only then revealed that he was Anthimos, whom they were seeking. The soldiers, astonished by Anthimos' kindness, suggested that he hide, saying they would tell the emperor that they could not find him. But Anthimos replied that he could not let himself transgress God's commandment against falsehood to save his life, and he went with the soldiers. Along the way, all the soldiers came to believe in Christ and were baptized by Anthimos. The emperor had Anthimos harshly tortured for a long time, and then had him beheaded with an axe. He glorified the Lord and went to his rest at the beginning of the fourth century.

A READING: from the Second Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians

BRETHREN, the one who strengthened you and us in Christ, who anointed us, is God, who also stamped us with his seal and gave us the Spirit as a pledge in our hearts. Now, I call God to witness against my soul that it was to spare you that I did not come again to Corinth. Not that we lord it over your faith, but rather we are fellow-workers in your joy, for in faith you stand.

(2: 1) I made up my mind not to come to you again in sorrow. For if I make you sad, who can gladden me; save the very one who is grieved by me? And I wrote to you as I did, that when I come, I may not have sorrow upon sorrow from those who ought to give me joy: for I trust in all of you that my joy is a joy to all of you. For I wrote to you in much affliction and anguish of heart, with many tears, not that you might be grieved, but that you might know the great love I have for you.

Gospel: 14th Sunday of Pentecost, Matthew 22: 2-14 THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO ST. MATTHEW THE EVANGELIST

The Lord told this parable: The kingdom of heaven is like a king who made a marriage feast for his son. And he sent his servants to call in those invited to the marriage feast, but they would not come. Again he sent out other servants saying .'Tell those who are invited, behold. I have prepared my dinner: my oxen and fatlings arc killed, and everything is ready; come to the marriage feast.' But they made light of it, and went off, one to his own farm and another to his business; and the rest laid hold of his servants treated them shamefully, and killed them. But when the king heard of it, he was angry; and he sent his armies, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The marriage feast indeed is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy; go therefore to the crossroads, and invite to the marriage feast whomever you shall find.' And his servants went out into the roads and gathered all those they found, both good and bad; and the marriage feast was filled with guests. Now the king went in to see the guests, and he saw there a man who had not on a wedding garment. And he said to him, 'Friend, how did you come in here without a wedding garment?' But he was speechless. Then the king said to the attendants, 'Bind his hands and feet, take hold of him, and throw him out into the darkness, where there will be weeping and the gnashing of teeth.' For many are called, but few are chosen."

قال الربُّ هذا المثل: يُشبَّهُ ملكوتُ السماواتِ بإنسانِ ملكٍ صنعَ عُرساً لابنهِ. وأرسَلَ عبيدَهُ ليَدعُوا المَّدعُوينَ إلى العُرس، فلَم يُريدوا أَن يَأْتُوا. فأرسلَ من جديدٍ عبيداً آخرين وقال: قُولوا للمَدعُوّين، ها إني قد أُعددتُ غدائي، ثيراني ومُسمَّناتي قد ذُبِحتْ، وكلُّ شيءٍ مُهيًّا، فلهموا إلى العرُس. ولكنهم تهاوَنوا، فذَهبَ هذا الى حقلهِ الخاصّ، وذاك إلى تجارته، والباقون قبضوا على عبيدهِ فشتموهم وقتلوهم. فلمَّا سمِعَ ذلك الملكُ غضِبَ، وأرسلَ جُيوشَهُ فأهلكَ أُولئك القتلة، وأحرق مدينَتهُم. حينئذ قالَ لعبيده: أما العرسُ فمُعَدُّ، وأمَّا المدعُوُّون فغيرُ مستحِقّين. فاذهبوا إلى مفارق الطُّرق، وكلُّ مَن وجدتُموهُ فأدعوهُ الى العُرس. فخَرجَ أُولئِكَ العبيدُ الى الطُّرُق، وجمعوا كلَّ مَن وَجَدوا مِن أَشرار وصالحين، فحفَلَ العُرسُ بالمتَّكِين. فلمَّا دخَل الملِّكُ لينظُرَ المتكئين، رأى هُناكَ إنساناً ليس عليهِ خُلَّهُ العُرس. فقال لهُ: يا صاح، كيف دَخلْتَ إلى ههنا، وليس عليك حُلَّهُ العُرس؟ فسكَت. حينئذِ قالَ المَلِكُ للخُدَّام: أُوثقوا يدَيهِ ورجليةِ وخوذه وأطرَحوهُ في الظُّلمةِ الخارجيَّة. هُناكَ يَكُونُ البُكاءُ وصَريفُ الأَسنانِ فإنَّ المدعُوِّينَ كثيرون، والمختارينَ قليلون.
