

The Office of Daily Vespers

(for Weekdays and Saturdays on 4th & 5th Class Feasts)

DOOR PRAYERS AND VESTING

When the time of Vespers has come, the priest comes before the Holy Doors. He kisses the Epitrachelion, blesses it and puts it on. He makes three metanies, each time saying:

O God, be propitious to me a sinner and have mercy on me.

INTRODUCTORY PRAYERS

P: Blessed ✠ is our God at all times, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

All: Amen.

(During the Paschal Season the following prayers are replaced by “Christ is Risen...” 3 times, then go directly to “Holy God...”)

Heavenly King, Consoler, Spirit of Truth, present in all places and filling all things, the Treasury of blessings and the Giver of life, come and dwell in us, cleanse us of all stain, and save our souls, O Good One.

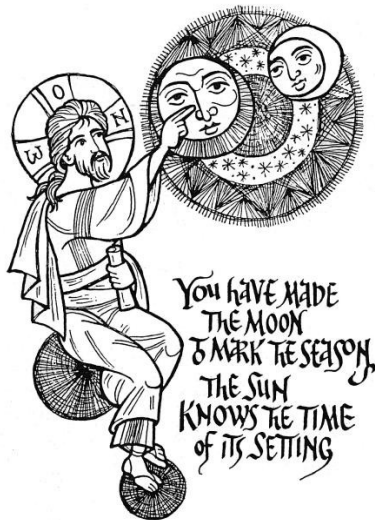

The reader or ecclesiarch begins Psalm 103. While this is done the priest uncovers his head, and standing before the icon of Christ, quietly recites the Prayers of Light (text on pages 37ff). When finished, the priest returns to his place before the Holy Doors and covers his head.

All: To You, O Lord.

P: For all glory, honor and worship are Your due, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

All: Amen.

If there is no Kathismata, the priest enters the Holy Place. If there is, he remains outside at the Cantor stand for the Kathismata, returning to the center for the Little Litany. He then enters the Holy Place after the Ekphonesis.

KATHISMA

The Kathisma Psalms are, in general, no longer done. If, however, they are done then they are recited as follows:

- 1. From the Sunday of St. Thomas until the leave-taking of the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross; from the Vigil of Christmas until the leave-taking of Theophany; and during the mid-lenten week and cheese-fare week:*

If the Kathisma psalms are done they are followed by a little litany:

P: Again and again in peace, let us pray to the Lord.

All: Lord, have mercy.

P: Help us, save us, have mercy on us and protect us, O God, by Your grace.

All: Lord, have mercy.

P: Remembering our all-holy, spotless, most highly blessed and glorious lady the Theotokos and ever-virgin Mary with all the saints, let us commend ourselves and one another and our whole life to Christ God.

All: To You, O Lord.

P: For Yours is the dominion and Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

All: Amen.

THE LAMP-LIGHTING PSALMS

After the Ekphonesis, the priest enters the Holy Place and prepares the incense. Meanwhile, we begin chanting Psalm 140 - "O Lord, to You I call" in the tone of the 1st sticheron (music on pages 21ff). The priest begins the incensation at "Let my prayer rise like incense." He censes the holy table, the iconostasis and the entire church, returning to the Holy Place to finish the incensing.

Psalm 140

The 6th Sticheron is inserted at this point. The Stichera can be found in the Menaion or other Liturgical books for the celebration of the day.

The 5th Sticheron is inserted at this point.

From the watch of dawn until the night,

The 3rd Sticheron is inserted at this point.

The 1st Sticheron is inserted at this point, followed by the Minor Doxology in tone (music on pages 29ff).

The (Stravro-) Theotokion is inserted at this point.

When the cantor(s) have finished the (Stravro-) Theotokion, we begin chanting immediately the Hymn of Athenogenes the Martyr:

(music on page 33)



Joyful Light of the holy glory of the Father immortal: heavenly, holy, blessed Jesus Christ! Since we have come to the setting of the sun and have seen the evening light, we praise God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. It is proper for You to be praised at all times by fitting melodies. O Son of God, Giver of Life, therefore the world glorifies You!

After the hymn, the priest opens the North Door and, standing in the doorway, proclaims:

P: The Prokimenon of Vespers!

The reader chants the Prokimenon of the day (music on pages 34ff). All answer in the customary manner.

Sunday Evening:

Come, bless the Lord, all you servants of the Lord. *(twice)*

~ You who stand in the house of the Lord and in the court of the house of God.

~ The Lord is my shepherd: I shall not want.

Wednesday Evening:

O God, by Your name save me, and by Your might defend my
cause. (*twice*)

~ Hear my prayer, O Lord, and let my cry come to You.

O God, by Your name save me, and by Your might defend my
cause.

Thursday Evening:

My help is from the Lord, who made Heaven and earth. (*twice*)

~ I will lift up my eyes from the hills whence my help
comes forth.

Friday Evening:

O God, You are my protector; O God, Your mercy goes before
me. (*twice*)

~ O God, deliver me from my foe, save me from those who
oppose me.

O God, You are my protector; O God, Your mercy goes before

The priest or ecclesiarch says aloud:

~Deign, O Lord, to keep us this evening without sin.

~Blessed are You, O Lord, God of our Fathers! Praised and glorified is Your name for ever. Amen.

~O Lord, let Your mercy rest upon us, for we have placed our trust in You.

~Blessed ✠ are You, O Lord: teach me Your statutes! (*metany*)

~Blessed ✠ are You, O Master: grant that I may understand Your statutes! (*metany*)

~Blessed ✠ are You, O Holy One: enlighten me with Your statutes! (*metany*)

~Everlasting is Your love, O Lord: turn not away from the work of Your hands.

~Indeed, praise, adoration and glory are Your due, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen.

THE AITESIS

From his place before the Holy Doors, the priest intones the Aitesis:

P: Let us complete our evening prayer to the Lord.

All: Lord, have mercy.

P: Help us, save us, have mercy on us and protect us, O God, by Your grace.

All: Lord, have mercy.

P: That this whole evening may be perfect, holy, peaceful and without sin, let us ask the Lord.

All: Grant this, O Lord.

P: For an angel of peace, a faithful guide and guardian of our souls and bodies, let us ask the Lord.

All: Grant this, O Lord.

P: For the forgiveness and remission of our sins and offenses, let us ask the Lord.

All: Grant this, O Lord.

P: For what is good and profitable to our souls, and for peace in the world, let us ask the Lord.

All: Grant this, O Lord.

P: That the rest of our life may be spent in peace and repentance, let us ask the Lord.

All: Grant this, O Lord.

P: That the end of our life may be Christian, painless, unashamed and peaceful, and for a good defense before the awesome judgment-seat of Christ, let us ask.

All: Grant this, O Lord.

P: Remembering our all-holy, spotless, most highly blessed and glorious Lady the Theotokos and ever-Virgin Mary, with all the saints, let us commend ourselves and one another and our whole life to Christ God.

All: To You, O Lord.

P: For You are merciful, O God, and You love mankind, and to You we render glory, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

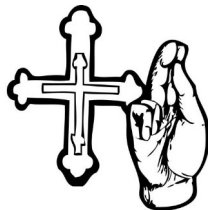
All: Amen.

APOSTICHA

The cantors intone the appropriate Aposticha and verses. On 4th class feasts, the Aposticha are proper and can be found in the Menaion. On Friday evenings, Aposticha can be found in the Octoechos or other Liturgical books.

On Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Sunday evenings:

A verse from the Octoechos or other Liturgical books is added here.

TROPARIA

The Troparion of the Saint or feast of the day is chanted. If there are multiple Troparia, “Glory to the Father...” and “now and forever...” are intercalated between them as appropriate.

P: Again, we pray for those who bear offerings, those who do good works in this holy and most venerable church, those who toil, those who sing and all the people here present who await from You great and abundant mercy.

All: Lord, have mercy. (*three times*)

P: For You are merciful, O God, and You love mankind, and we render glory to You, to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

All: Amen.

P: Wisdom!

All: A blessing!

The priest turns to the icon of Christ and, making the sign of the Cross, says:

P: Christ our God, the Existing One, is blessed at all times, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

The ecclesiarch answers:

Amen. Make firm, O Christ God, the holy Orthodox Faith in this holy church for ever and ever. Amen.

The priest turns toward the icon of the Theotokos and, making the sign of the Cross, says:

P: O all-holy Theotokos, save us!

The second in rank answers:

More honorable than the cherubim and more glorious beyond compare than the seraphim, who without stain bore God the Word: you are truly Theotokos, you do we exalt!

P: Glory to You, Christ God, our Hope, glory to You!

All: Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Lord, have mercy. (*three times*)

Give the blessing, Father, in the name of the Lord.

P: May Christ our true God, through the prayers of His spotless and all-pure Mother,

on Wed/Fri. and through the power of the glorious and life-giving cross...

of His glorious Apostles who are worthy of all praise,

on Mon. and through the intercession of the heavenly, honorable and bodiless powers of Heaven...

on Tues. and through the intercession of the glorious prophet the Forerunner, John the Baptist...

on Thurs. and of our Father among the saints, Nicholas the wonderworker Archbishop of Myra in Lycia...

on Sat. and through the intercession of the holy, glorious and triumphant martyrs, and of our God bearing Fathers...

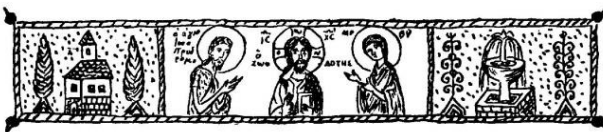
and through the intercession of St. *N.*, patron of this holy church
