أحد القديس توما – The Sunday of St. Thomas

This Sunday commemorates some of the first appearances of the Resurrected Lord. Jesus Christ, present in all places and filling all things, pushes past physical and emotional boundaries. And as Jesus Christ liberated the souls in Hades, he liberated the disciples from fear when he breathed the Holy Spirit upon them and gave them peace. <u>Troparion of St. Thomas</u>: (Tone 7) [3 times] While the tomb was sealed You shone forth from it, O Christ our Life, and while the doors remained closed, You stood among your Disciples, O Resurrection of all, and through them You restored a new spirit in us according to Your great mercy.

Kontakion of St Thomas: (Tone 8)

O Christ God, Thomas explored Your vivifying side with an eager hand; and since You had entered the room while the doors were closed, He cried out with the other Apostles: "You are my Lord and my God."

Kondakion of Pascha: (Tone 2 or 8)

Though You went down in the tomb, O immortal One, You overthrew the power of Hades and rose victorious, O Christ God. You greeted the ointment bearing women, saying "Rejoice!" You gave peace to Your apostles, and to those who had Fallen resurrection.

In those days by the hands of the apostles many signs and wonders were done among the people (and with one accord, they all would meet in Solomon's portico; but of the rest, no one dared to associate with them, yet the people made much of them. اعمال الرسل (5: 12-20)

في تلك الآيام، جرت على ايدي الرسلِ آياتٌ وعجائب كثيرة في الشُّعب. وكانوا كلُّهم بنفسٍ واحدةٍ في رواقِ سليمان. ولم يكن احدٌ من الآخرين يجترئ ان يُخالطهم، بل كان الشعبُ يعظمُهم وكان جماعاتٌ من رجالِ ونساءٍ ينضمون بكثرةٍ، مؤمنينَ بالربّ، حتى إنهم كانوا يخرجون بالمرضى الى الشوارع، ويضعونهم على فُرُشِ pallets, in order that, as Peter went by, at least his shadow would fall upon some of them. And crowds also came to Jerusalem from neighboring towns, and they brought the sick and those afflicted with unclean spirits — and all of them were healed.

But the High Priest rose up, and all his supporters (that is, the members of the Sadducean sect), and being filled with hatred, they laid their hands upon the apostles and threw them into the public jail. But during the night, an angel of the Lord opened the doors of the prison, and led them out, saying: "Go, and standing in the temple, speak to the people all the words of this life."

<u>ALLELUIA</u> (Tone 8) Come, let us rejoice in the Lord, let us sing gladly to God our Savior!

Stichon: For the Lord is a great God, and a great King above all gods.

Gospel of the Feast:, John 20: 19-31

When it was late, that same day, the first of the week, though the doors where the disciples gathered had been closed for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in the midst and said to them, "Peace be to you!" And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples therefore rejoiced at the sight of the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be to you! As the Father has sent me, I also send you." When he had said this, he breathed upon them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit; whose sins you shall forgive, they are forgiven them; and whose sins you shall retain, they are retained." Now Thomas, one of the Twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. The other disciples therefore said to him. "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them. "Unless I see in his hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the place of the nails, and put my hand into his side I will not believe." And after eight days, his disciples were again inside, and Thomas with them. Jesus came, the doors being closed, and stood in their midst, and said, "Peace be to you!" Then he said to Thomas. "Bring here your finger, and see my hands; and bring here your hand, and put it into my side; and be not unbelieving, but believing." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Because you have seen me, Thomas, you have believed. Blessed are those who have not seen, and yet have believed." Many other signs also Jesus worked in the sight of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name.

Hirmos: (Tone 5)

O shining light, O Mother of God, honorable without compare; you are higher in dignity than any other creature. We magnify you with hymns.

في عشية ذلك اليوم عينه، وهو الاولُ في الاسبوع، والابواب مغلقة، حيثُ كان التلاميذُ مجتمعين خوفاً من اليهود، جاء يسوغ ووقف في الوسطِ وقالَ لهم: السلامُ لكم. ولمَّا قال هذا أراهُم يديه وجنبَهُ، ففرح التلاميذُ إذ أبصروا الرب. وقال لهم يسوعُ ثانيةً: السلام لكم، كما أرسلني ألاّب كذلك أنا أرسلكم. ولما قال هذا نفخ فيهم وقال لهم: خُذوا الروحَ القدس. مَن غفرتُم خطاياهم تُغفَرْ لهم، ومن أمسكتم خطاياهم أُمسِكَت. وان توما أحدَ الاثني عشر الذي يُقالُ له التوأم، لم يكن معهم حين جاءَ يسوع. فقال له التلاميذُ الآخرون: إننا قد رايناً الرب. فقال لهم إنْ لم أرَ موضعَ المساميرِ في يديهِ، وأضعْ إصبعي في موضع المسامير، وأُضعْ يدي في جنبةِ لا أُومن. وبعد ثمانيةِ أَيامٍ كَنْ تَلَامَيُّذُهُ أَيضًا دَاخَلًا وتَوما معهم. فأتى يسوع والابوابُ مغلقةٌ ووقف في الوسطِ وقال السلامُ لكم. ثم قال لتوما: هاتِ إصبعَك الى ههنا. وعاينْ يدَيَّ، وهاتِ يدَك وضعَها في جنبي، ولا تكُن غيرَ مؤمنٍ بل مؤمناً. أجاب توما وقال له: ربي والهي! قال له يسوع: لأنك رأيتني يا توما آمنت طوبي للذين لم يَروا وآمنوا. وآياتِ أُخرَ كثيرةً صنعَ يسوع أَمامَ تلاميذهِ لم تُكتَبْ في هذا الكتاب. وإنما كُتبَت هذه لتؤمنوا بأنَّ يسوعَ المسيحَ هو ابنُ الله. ولتكون لكم إذا آمنتم، الحياةُ
